

SBM4303 Enterprise Architecture

Unit description

This unit of study broadens the key understanding of major widely accepted Enterprise Architecture (EA) domains, layers and frameworks concisely to a general business audience. This unit explores the different stages of adopting an EA along with the critical investigation on EA governance, and justifies that how it fits in with other key roles in the organisation. This includes articulating and exploring the information, the business, and strategies for change and planning for business continuity in the context of emerging EA.

This unit is a core unit in the BBIS program.
