

## Unit of Study Guide: BUS5004: Leadership and Influence

Trimester 1, 2023

### Overview

BUS5004 *Leadership and Influence* introduces students to theoretical concepts and practical examples to demonstrate how organisations develop and adapt to changing environments. It also considers how organisations improve their performance and leadership to achieve sustainability. The unit emphasizes the role of leadership and leadership development in organisational contexts and also aims to develop effective leadership skills. On completion of this unit students will be able to challenge traditional hierarchical and dominant leadership and management axioms and explore what leadership means in a globally connected contemporary context.
