

BUS6003 Business Law

Unit Description

This unit examines the legal, business, and ethical environment in which local and international contemporary businesses operate. It focuses on ethical principles that require an examination of the human consequences to corporate decision-making and on the increasing importance of social corporate responsibility for business.

1. Articulate the legal framework in which Australian and international businesses operate and describe the core concepts as they relate to project management.

4. Effectively communicate a business law case analysis through reports and presentations to a variety of stakeholder groups.
