

Unit of Study Guide: PRJ5002 Enterprise and Resource Planning

Trimester 3, 2023

Unit Description

The PRJ5002 Enterprise and Resource Planning unit is focused on the core project management knowledge areas of resources, stakeholders, and communication management. The unit develops core competencies to identify, acquire, and manage resources needed for the successful completion of a project, and communication skills to effectively manage resources and the needs of stakeholders.

Unit topics introduce enterprise and resource planning and management including using computer applications to support and control resources and processes. Other topics cover communication and stakeholder management, and critically review a range of contemporary project management practice models and approaches.

Through learning and assessment activities, students apply knowledge, techniques, and skills in the management of resources, communication, and stakeholders in different project situations; work collaboratively with others in a team environment and communicate plans to technical and non-technical stakeholders; and analyse and manage stakeholder expectations and their impact on a project.
