

BUS2001 Project Management Fundamentals and Practices

Unit Description

The unit also examines risk management strategies, approaches to reduce project duration, and methods for measuring performance and evaluating progress. Finally, the process of project closure is covered, ensuring participants understand the importance of post-project evaluation and delivery. This unit offers practical insights applicable to various industries, preparing learners to manage projects efficiently and effectively.
