

BUS3008 Project Execution Planning and Management

Unit Description

This unit offers students the opportunity to develop an understanding of project execution planning along with the project management processes in four core knowledge areas as described in Project Management Book of Knowledge (PMBOK® Guide).

Students will learn how to apply the fundamentals of project management to the work undertaken by contractors and suppliers to put together a tender/proposal in response to call for tenders or Request for Proposal (RFP) from a client organisation. Students will also be exposed to the concept of project risk and quality, their standards, and implications in successful project delivery. In addition, students will also learn about conflict management and its role in addressing the project management challenges.

Unit Learning Outcomes

On successful completion of this unit, students will be able to:

1. Apply project management concepts and processes, including contracting, tendering, leasing, and procurement, to business contexts.
2. Evaluate the role of relevant quality standards in effective project management.
3. Identify and critically evaluate the risks associated with projects and develop risk mitigation strategies.
4. Apply conflict management practices to project management challenges and propose strategies for effective conflict management.
